# Minutes from Last Month's Club Meeting by Bill Morgan

The GCWW club met 0n 2/13/20 at Earle Smith's shop. In attendance were Bill Nay, Gregg Zumwalt, Ray Hucek, Arthur Barber, Mike Ruttgen, Earle Smith, Mike Mitchell, Robert Rothenbucher, Venton Knarr, Harold Blalock, Stan Townsend, Shaun Garbry, Jeff Rienward, Don Nelson and Bill Morgan.

Bill Nay called the meeting to order and led the group in a discussion of a few items of club business.

Ray Hucek reported that the club has a little over \$1400 in the bank and no outstanding bills. The club does not currently collect dues from the membership.

The majority of the group agreed that we should rent a table at the upcoming Wood Carving and Arts Festival in Broken Arrow. Set up will be on Thursday June 18 and the festival runs Friday and Saturday (6/19 & 6/20). As noted in last month's newsletter, an 8' X 10' space will cost \$45 and a rental table goes for \$15. Applications for space need to be in by late May. We'll work out the details and have sign up sheets at the next couple of club meetings.

It was agreed that this month's 4th Thursday dinner will be at Fish Daddy's. Bill Morgan will send out the usual reminder early that week.

Earle Smith had set up 3 saw blade cleaning stations and reviewed several products and techniques he's used over the years to clean accumulated pitch off his table saw blades. As Earle demonstrated, a simple mix of water and laundry detergent does a great job of loosening up the pitch with no risk of damage to the painted sides of the blade, the bond between the carbide tips and the body of the blade or to your hands. After a few minutes of soak time, the pitch can be easily removed with a brush with metal bristles or even an old tooth brush.

Mike Ruttgen makes a lot of picture frames and demonstrated the technique he uses to ensure an accurate 45 degree angle for the corner miters. He uses a dedicated sled and went through the steps required to adjust the sled to ensure a good corner fit even if there is some variation in the table saw alignment.

Shaun Garbry brought in a wall mounted message pad that he built for his wife. It consists of paper roll mounted on a flat backboard made with alternating wood types (much as a cutting board is) with a hack saw blade mounted near the bottom edge that provides a convenient cut off device.

Earle provided a nice heated shop complete with coffee and snacks and as usual it was a great forum for exchanging woodworking knowledge and sharing experiences.

The March meeting will be at Bill Morgan's shop and he'll review the restoration of a small piece of furniture he's working on as well as the construction of a jig for cutting circles on the band saw. He'll also solicit some advice on how to proceed with the project.


