



I built a "Norm Abram designed" router cabinet 8 years ago and have always had to prop a support under the dust port exit assembly; the PVC hub and dust collection hose were too much weight for the friction fit couplings. So I came up with the below design.

The board is long enough to support where the hose connects to the PVC hub fitting. And when not in use, it is short enough to fold/hinge flat against the cabinet.

A simple cord and hook hold the wooden support at the correct height during use.


